How do you use this map?

Use the Zoom in tool (+) (or the roller ball on your mouse) to see Future land Use or Zoning data. Zoom in close enough and parcel information will show as well. These tools provide zoom in (+), zoom out (-) and go to full screen (house icon).


You can also use the search tool with either the short (12 digit) parcel number or address to zoom into the map



Once you've zoomed in close enough for zoning and land use (and perhaps parcel) information to show, if

you left mouse click on the map a pop up appears. Note in the example shown, the pop up shows (1 of 3) as there are three layers of data coincident to the point picked. Use the small arrow to toggle between the layers that are coincident to see their information.
